Curriculum Plan

In EYFS children are taught about 'People and Communities' as part of their 'Understanding the World' developmental matters. Children in nursery are encouraged to comment and ask questions about aspects of their familiar world, such as the place they live or the natural world. Children develop an understanding of growth, decay and changes over time. Throughout Reception, children continue to look closely at similarities and differences in relation to places, objects, materials and living things. They talk about their own immediate environment and how environments may vary from one another, i.e. past and present

In KS1, we teach history every term, repeating key objectives to deepen understanding

In KS2 we teach four history themes per key stage taken from the NC over two years. This ensures the key concepts are embedded and a balance of world and British history is taught that deepens understanding of the subject.
